## How to make the Slides Project in Full Screen and Other Navigation Tips

### PROBLEMS WITH SKIPPING ANIMATIONS WHEN USING A REMOTE CONTROLLER:

Please note, **we recently tested two new models of commonly used remote controllers for LCD projected slides: Targus Wireless Presenter PC/Netbook compatible, AND the Logitech Professional Presenter R800** and these two models move forward and backward from slide to slide just fine, **BUT, when going forward, they SKIP animations that are built into the slides. We then tested the Presentation Remote by Tripp-Lite / Keyspan, Model PR-US2** and this model does not skip animations.

**Therefore, the solutions for being able to show the slides without skipping animations include the following:**

- a) Purchase the Tripp-Lite / Keyspan PR-US2 remote controller (shown in photo)
- b) Or, don't use a remote when you display slides that have animations (for example, the midgut volvulus slide that shows twisting of the bowel when you 'click' to animate the twist; or the UVC slides that show the line position when you 'click' to animate (S.T.A.B.L.E. Learner Course slides only). We are not listing ALL animations here, just giving you an idea of slides you can look at to see if your remote controller also skips animations.
- c) Or, use a WIRELESS MOUSE, not a remote controller. This will limit how far you can be from your computer, but at least you don't have to stand right at the computer if you use a wireless mouse.



**If you are having difficulty opening the slide module on a PC**, then select the module of interest, and use your "right click" mouse button and then select "open with Explorer". The slides should then open.

*Now that you have opened the slide module there are a few things you can do to make this go well!*

### To View the Slides in Full Screen

First, close any other windows, folders, or programs you have open on your computer since that will affect your ability to view the slides in **Full Screen**.

**If using a PC computer**, once the module is open, click on the View tab and see what your "quick keys" are for View Full Screen. On my computer, it is F11. This will work IF you have closed any other tabs or windows that you have open.

Press F11 and the slides should be in full screen. When you are finished viewing the slides, you may have to press F11 again so you can get rid of the full screen view and be able to use your navigation bar that is hidden.

**If using a MAC computer**, once the module is open, Click on the View tab, then click on Enter Presentation Mode. This will make the view go to full screen. If you want to see your top navigation bar back, then you will have to Leave Presentation Mode.

### Please practice navigating the slides by trying these things:

- 1) Use the larger triangle button on the bottom left of the screen to move the slides forward.

- 2) Use the double arrow buttons, also on the bottom left of the screen, to move the slides forward and backward.
- 3) Notice that if using the double arrow button, you will skip animations on the slide. You should only use the double arrow button to move forward if you want to move quickly ahead. To go back, you will need to use the back double arrow button, or you can use the "thumbnails" described below.
- 4) Place your mouse cursor on the slide (not the black border of the slide). Then use your space bar or a mouse click to advance the slide, one animation at a time. You do not need to use the large triangle button to move ahead so long as you place your mouse cursor onto the slide somewhere.
- 5) Click on the thumbnails icon at the bottom of the slide. This will show you all the slides in case you want to skip ahead or behind. Once you locate where you want to go, click on thumbnails again to make them go off the screen.
- 6) Click on the outlines icon at the bottom of the slide. This will show a list of all slides and can also be used to locate a slide of interest.
- 7) Show students the 'progress bar' at the bottom of the screen. That will let them know how many more slides there are in the module.
- 8) **For the Learner Course Slides:**
  - a) Remember, you do not have to stay in the NICU or non-NICU version of the slides the entire time. If you think one version is more applicable than another version, then feel free to show that version.
